greater yellowlegs	<i>Tringa melanoleuca</i>
lesser yellowlegs	<i>Tringa flavipes</i>
solitary sandpiper	<i>Tringa solitaria</i>
spotted sandpiper	<i>Actitis macularius</i>
semipalmated sandpiper	<i>Calidris pusilla</i>
least sandpiper	<i>Calidris minutilla</i>
pectoral sandpiper	<i>Calidris melanotos</i>
dunlin	<i>Calidris alpina</i>
common snipe	<i>Gallinago gallinago</i>
long-billed dowitcher	<i>Limnodromus scolopaceus</i>
short-billed dowitcher	<i>Limnodromus griseus</i>
American woodcock	<i>Scolopax minor</i>

<sup>3</sup>For the 2 species of yellowlegs, you only need to be able to identify it as a yellowlegs (or *Tringa* spp.).

<sup>4</sup>For the 2 species of dowitcher, you only need to be able to identify it as a dowitcher (or *Limnodromus* spp.).
